AN ARTICLE OF INTEREST

Question: When we say the Penitential Act at Mass, why do we strike our chest three times?

Answer: Our rituals and liturgical celebrations are filled with a variety of symbols, some of which also relate to our gestures and physical postures (e.g. kneeling, sitting, processing, making the Sign of the Cross). The custom of striking our breast three times during the "I Confess" of the Penitential act of the Mass is one of those gestures that is loaded with symbolism.

The tradition of Christian's striking the breast (above the heart) is rooted in the image of Sacred Scripture, especially text like Psalm 51 which speak of a "humbled contrite heart" or how God heals broken hearts, binding up our wounds. Early Christian writers like St. Augustine of Hippo and St. Jerome also refer to this custom in their writings.

Ultimately this practice is an expression of our sorrow for those times when we have been guilty of faults and a sign that we are willing to take responsibility for our sins and failings. That we all perform this gesture together is also an act of solidarity, recognizing that none of us, regardless of where we are in our journey of faith, is without fault and the need for grace and forgiveness. -- Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

Procesión y Misa de Guadalupe Domingo 5 de diciembre



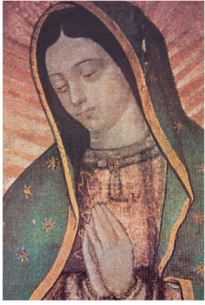

Guadalupe procession & Mass Sunday, December 5th

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles will host the 90th annual Procession and Mass in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe in East Los Angeles on Sunday, December 5th. This year's theme is "*Our Lady of Guadalupe: Always Forward in Mission ad Hope*," in commemoration of the special Jubilee Year celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the Mission San Gabriel Arcángel, the founding church of the Archdiocese. The festivities will begin at 10:30 am at the corner of Cesar Chavez Avenue and Ford Boulevard with a procession featuring floats, indigenous dance groups, mariachi and faithful from throughout the Archdiocese. Prizes will be awarded to participating floats that best represent this year's theme, based on overall creativity and beauty of the float's presentation. The procession will conclude at the East Los Angeles College Stadium at 1:00 pm with a Mass presided by Archbishop Jose H. Gomez and concelebrated by the auxiliary bishops and priests from throughout the Archdiocese. All are welcome to this beautiful and historic tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego.

A Holy Door represents Jesus Christ, who states: *"I am the door"* ([John 10:1](#)). Christ is the entry to new life. To cross the threshold of the Holy Door is to step into Christ, and to pass through the doors of the Church into the world is to step into mission. The Lord we encounter in the Church, above all in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, sends us forth from there to be missionaries of the Gospel.

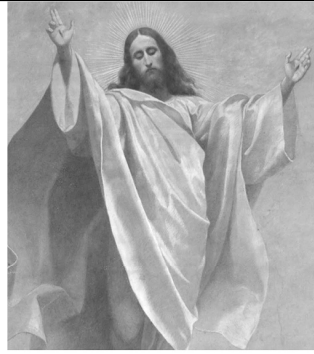

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

If *the end is near* or at least coming for certain, Someone else is even nearer, indeed with us already! For one thing, today's Hebrews reading offers us this blessed assurance: "by one offering (Jesus) has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated" (Hebrews 10:14). So, by the all-sufficient sacrifice of Christ, forgiveness is ours, our "consecration" having begun in Baptism. Christ's sacrifice, offered once and for all on the cross, is now made ever present in the Church's Eucharistic Sacrifice, the Mass. But even before we hear Hebrews proclaim such Good News, we need to listen with joyful hope to Daniel. For, at that very time Daniel declares "unsurpassed in distress," Daniel promises "at that time your people shall escape, everyone who is found written in the book" (Daniel 12:1). Recalling Hebrews again, the writing of Daniel's "book," namely the Book of Life, begins when our names are inscribed on the day of our Baptism.



GOOD NEWS IN THE END

Seen then as positive, Daniel's predictions blossom even more beautifully in Jesus' Good News. Indeed, Jesus invokes that very image: "Learn a lesson from the fig tree" (Mark 13:28). Consider well: Jesus does not predict produce that comes forth withered, or even worse, poisoned, ending in (for many of us) winter's forthcoming thick clouds, deep snow, and brutal cold. Placing before our eyes instead a gloriously lovely and positive image, Jesus declares: "When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near" (12:28). So where is the "Gospel good" in today's passage? Precisely in what happens after "that tribulation" and "the powers being shaken" in the Gospel's opening lines (12:24-25). For Jesus promises that we will "see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory' " (12:26). Jesus "will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky" (12:27): Jesus' whole family gathered together, the little and lowly lifted up, the lost sheep found. Tender indeed is Jesus' mercy; blessed fruit that endures and nourishes us into eternity! So, we hope indeed that the end is near!

Trigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Si el final está cerca o, al menos, se acerca con seguridad, hay alguien que está aún más cerca, es más, ¡ya está con nosotros! Por un lado, la lectura de hoy de la carta a los hebreos nos ofrece esta bendita seguridad: "con esta única ofrenda (Jesús) ha hecho perfectos de una vez para siempre a quienes han sido consagrados" (Hebreos 10:14). Así pues, por el sacrificio omnipotente de Cristo, el perdón es nuestro, habiendo comenzado nuestra "consagración" en el Bautismo. El sacrificio de Cristo, ofrecido de una vez

por todas en la cruz, se hace ahora siempre presente en el Sacrificio Eucarístico de la Iglesia, la Misa. Pero incluso antes de escuchar a Hebreos proclamar esta Buena Nueva, debemos escuchar con alegre esperanza a Daniel. Porque, en ese mismo momento que Daniel declara "insuperable en la angustia", Daniel promete que "cuando llegue ese momento, todos los hijos de tu pueblo que estén escritos en el libro se salvarán" (Daniel 12:1). Evocando de nuevo a Hebreos, la Escritura del "libro" de Daniel, es decir, el Libro de la vida, comienza cuando se inscriben nuestros nombres el día de nuestro bautismo.

BUENAS NOTICIAS AL FINAL

Vistas entonces como algo positivo, las predicciones de Daniel florecen aún más hermosamente en la Buena Nueva de Jesús. De hecho, Jesús invoca esa misma imagen: "Fíjense en el ejemplo de la higuera" (Marcos 13:28). Considérenlo bien: Jesús no predice un producto que sale marchito, o peor aún, envenenado, y que termina en (para muchos de nosotros) las densas nubes del invierno que se avecina, la nieve profunda y el frío brutal. Poniendo ante nuestros ojos, en cambio, una imagen gloriosamente hermosa y positiva, Jesús declara "Cuando sus ramas se ponen tiernas y brotan las hojas, saben que se acerca el verano" (13:28). Entonces, ¿dónde está el "bien del Evangelio" en el pasaje de hoy? Precisamente en lo que sucede después de "esa tribulación" y "los poderes que se tambalean" en las primeras líneas del Evangelio (12:24-25). Porque Jesús promete que "veremos al Hijo del hombre venir en las nubes con gran poder y gloria" (13:26). Jesús "enviará a los ángeles y reunirá a sus elegidos de los cuatro vientos, desde el extremo de la tierra hasta el extremo del cielo" (12:27): Toda la familia de Jesús reunida, los pequeños y humildes levantados, la oveja perdida encontrada. La misericordia de Jesús es tierna, un fruto bendito que perdura y nos alimenta hasta la eternidad. Por eso, ¡esperamos que el final esté cerca!

FEAST OF FAITH

Blessing and Dismissal

At the beginning of Mass, the priest made the sign of the cross with us. At the conclusion of Mass, he makes the sign of the cross over us, a sign of blessing. We are then dismissed—not just let out, but sent forth with a mission "to love and serve the Lord." Just as Jesus blessed his disciples as he ascended to heaven, so this leave-taking is joined to a blessing, a prayer for God's continuing protection. As we leave the church, we bear the invisible sign of the Master whom we follow. In the words of an ancient letter to Diognetus, "Christians are indistinguishable from other [people] either by nationality, language, or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow an outlandish way of life. . . . And yet, there is something extraordinary about their lives" (*Liturgy of the Hours*, Vol. II, p. 840). We are ordinary people sent forth to live extraordinary lives, lives like Christ's own life—pouring ourselves out for others in prayer, service, and love.
